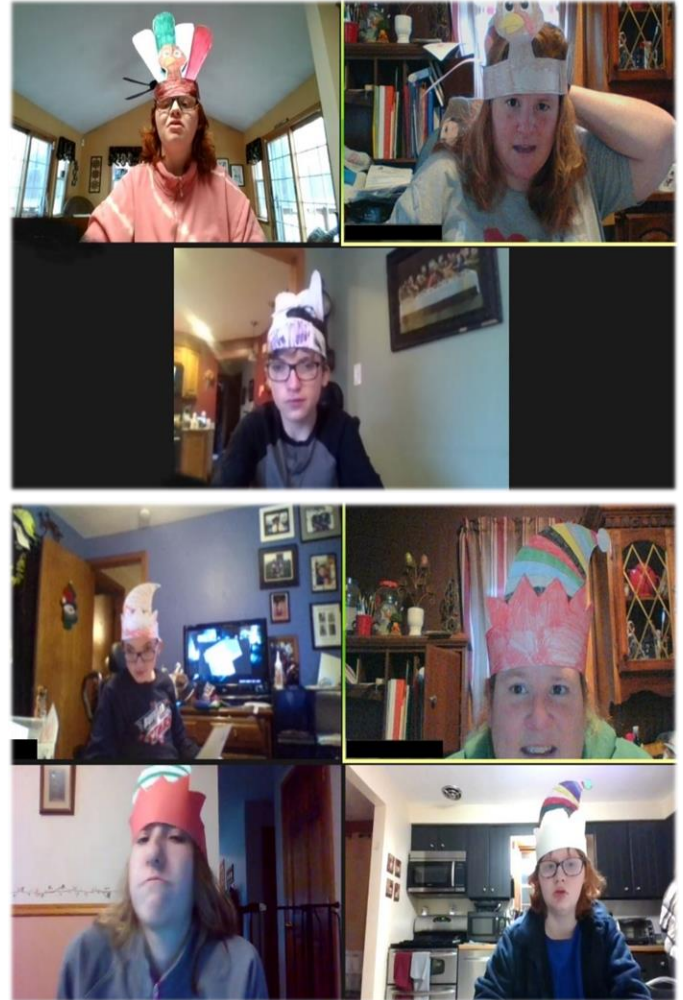
Pumpkin Carving
