DONOR SPOTLIGHT: The Chapins

Katie Chapin has cherished her home for most of her life. At just 17, she moved into the renovated 100-yearold farmhouse operated by Heritage Christian Services in Penfield. Now 41, Katie adores her home, but as she and her housemates have aged, the



layout featuring three bedrooms upstairs and three downstairs, steep stairs and narrow hallways, has become challenging to navigate.

Sue and Bob Chapin, Katie's parents, were thrilled to learn that Katie and her five housemates will soon have a fully accessible single-level home just down the street. The home is one of 12 Heritage Christian homes to be renovated or newly built under the Homes with Heart campaign. Homes with Heart benefits not just Katie and her housemates, but more than 50 others currently living in homes operated by Heritage Christian throughout Finger Lakes and western New York—and an estimated 400 people total over the next 60 years. Knowing the impact a gift to Homes with Heart will have for years to come, the Chapins knew they wanted to make a personal financial contribution.

Sue and Bob shared, "visiting an already built Homes with Heart home reaffirmed our decision to support the work. Katie's new home will be very open with lots of natural light. Having space to spread out is a plus for Katie. There will be much more room for storage and staff will no longer have their office on the second floor, allowing them to be more accessible."







HCS Enhances Wages for Staff

When frontline caring professionals are supported in their work, everyone wins. This is the "why" of Heritage Christian Services' wage and benefit strategy, which most recently included a salary increase for all employees, and an increase in the minimum wage for almost every position.

This is the third wage increase in two and a half years, reflecting the necessity of compensating frontline professionals accordingly for their dedication to the people they support. It's especially important when you consider that the majority of caring professionals are women, and more specifically women of color.

The costs of not addressing wages of caring professionals are already apparent. In a survey conducted by the New York Disability Advocates, 93% of New York care providers for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities reported a decrease in job applicants. During the last four years, 130 OPWDD-supported homes were forced to suspend their programs due to staffing shortages. Without addressing the needs of caring professionals, more will continue to leave the profession as a whole, and others may not even come to it.

"By elevating our caring professionals, we are elevating the level of care our agency provides," said Marisa Geitner, president and C.E.O. "It's a straightforward philosophy, and one I hope our industry can continue to get behind." †
