OPPORTUNITIES for all employees

Kamia McCullough came to Heritage Christian Services 17 years ago in a direct support role at the home on Schlegel Road in Webster. Kamia says she always had the support she needed to advance in her career, and in 2023, she became the director of the agency's Consumer Directed Personal Assistance Program, or CDPAP. She was also the recipient of the 2023 Jobina Bruinsma award, honoring a staff member who embodies leadership, determination and integrity. "Our agency a has amazing women in leadership roles," says Kamia. "As long as you communicate your desired career path, the agency will help you reach your goals." Heritage Christian Services was a recipient of the Rochester Business Journal's inaugural Elevating Women award, for its work on promoting leaders such as Kamia.

CARING for the CAREGIVER

From the frontline care professionals working directly with the people who choose our services, to the office staff who help maintain our business strategy and strengthen our relationships with the community, it takes many hands to make our work possible.

We continue to push for our workforce on multiple fronts, from recognition and respect for caring professionals, to opportunities for skill-building, career advancement and wage increases. Throughout the year, executive leadership surveyed and met with employees throughout the agency. From these conversations, we continue to learn from our staff about their work experiences.

One highlight is that the vast majority of staff members love the type of work they do, and they value their relationships with their supervisors.



Here's how we worked to advance our workforce in 2023:

- More than 1,000 staff members benefitted from wage increases for the third time in 2.5 years, including over 300 employees who achieved a new base of \$17.80 an hour.
- Employees participated in the NADSP E-Badge Academy, allowing them to learn online and earn badges and certifications. A total of 109 staff members earned certifications through the program by year-end, with more enrollees for the following year.

"The E-Badge Academy has impacted my perspective at work," says Liz, who works as the assistant manager at the home on Woodsboro Farms in Webster. "The courses I've taken have furthered my understanding of what truly person-centered practices are."

"What I've learned has helped me in my role as a frontline supervisor, which is important with so many new staff coming in and being trained," adds Renee, the manager at the day habilitation program in Perinton.



AGING IN PLACE

with comfort and dignity

The work within the \$9.1 million Homes with Heart campaign ensures that people we support can be afforded the same high-quality options to age-in-place that anyone would want for their loved ones. It will impact an estimated 400 people over the next 60 years.

Andy Osborn came to the home on Stone Road in

Pittsford 24 years ago. In that time, his physical needs have changed, and it has become harder for him to navigate his home. For brother Mike Osborn, who chairs the Homes with Heart campaign, it's important that Andy and so many people like him can continue to live in homes that are familiar, comfortable and accessible, even as they age.

Four people moved to Five Mile Line Road in Penfield after remodeling.

Six people moved to Names Road in Chili.

Renovations on a home on Joanne Drive in Sanborn were completed, and is where the people who previously lived at a home on **Hoover Road in Sanborn** now live. The work on the home on Hoover Road was also completed in the spring, and is now where the people who previously lived at a home on Oxbow Lane in Lewiston live.

> We acquired home on **Crittenden Road in Henrietta**, which will be home to six people.

By the end of 2023, **\$7.7 million** of the **\$9.1** million fundraising goal was raised for the campaign from **658 donors**.

Significant contributions in 2023 came from community partners, including the Riedman Foundation, Hoselton Foundation, Mother Cabrini Health Foundation, Golisano Foundation, Daisy Marauis Jones Foundation, Paychex Foundation, LeFrois Builders & Developers and Wegmans.

Angelina Cheng

Angelina Cheng and her family chose self-direction support in 2018. Her circle of support linked the family to a respite provider who speaks both Chinese and English, and who provides after school respite for her in Amherst on a regular basis.

"It's impossible to think of what Angelina will want decades from now," her father Chong says. "It puts me at peace to know we will still have the support we need many years from now."

The **self-direction** team at Heritage Christian has added 250 new people to the program and, for the first time in program history, supported over 1,600 people across the Finger Lakes and western New York. This makes it the fastest growing sector of the agency, offering services that meet each person's unique needs.

ACHIEVING INDEPENDENCE

When she was younger, Maricela wanted three things for herself: her own living space, to go to college and get a job. With guidance from her circle of support, she attended Nazareth University, moved into her own home and has meaningful work at Jewish Senior Life. "I am so proud of the amazing, independent woman my daughter has become," says Maricela Guzman, her mother.

In the Greater Rochester area in 2023, Heritage Christian hired 13 new **fiscal intermediary coordinators**, including one bilingual coordinator, to support people in many different ways. In western New York, four new staff members joined the fiscal intermediary team, including a new customized support associate director. The agency also established a housing coordinator position to help support nearly 200 people with housing subsidies.

BUILDING A CAREER

Chris Wells

Chris Wells has worked at the Olive Garden in Victor for 13 years, where he has become a trusted and reliable team member at a busy and dynamic location. The Employment Alliance at Heritage Christian Services helps match people with employment opportunities in their community. For Chris, the challenge was finding the place he felt most comfortable. When an opportunity arose at Olive Garden, Chris jumped on it and hasn't looked back. "I love what the Employment Alliance has done for Chris," says Tony, his father.

In 2023, the **Employment Alliance** supported nearly 425 people throughout the Finger Lakes and western New York, including connecting over 50 people to meaningful employment, supporting 150 students in building pre-employment skills, helping 40 people get jobs and 16 people earn paid internships.

"Being around animals has allowed Aiden to come out of his shell," says Denise, Aiden's mother. "He connected with the farm the very first day we brought him here."

In 2023, Heritage Christian Services renewed its partnership with Monroe County and successfully reopened Springdale Farm activities to the public, including seasonal events and educational opportunities for local school districts, 4H programs, colleges and more.

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
